Registration Information

- Registration closes midnight, February 24, 2018 or once 90 registrations reached.
- Open to residents/fellows of Canadian universities.
- The Course is intended primarily for PGY 3-5 Neurology Residents; other individuals may also be interested and are welcome to register, including residents in related specialties, neurology fellows, and PGY 1-2 neurology residents.
- The registration fee is \$350 + HST.

Course Program

 - Each case is allocated 15 min. for presentation plus 5 min. for discussion

Travel

- The Course will be held in Toronto at The Westin Harbour Castle.
- Parking at venue and mileage reimbursement will be covered for registrants driving to the Course.
- Travel (by train or air) will be booked for registrants living outside the GTA with the following conditions:
 - A representative from the travel agency serving the Course will contact you shortly after registration to arrange travel bookings.
 - To avoid unanticipated increases in fares, registrants will have 2 business days to respond to the travel agent with their flight selection. Registrants who do not respond within 2 business days will be responsible for paying any increase in fares that occurred since that communication.
 - The fare covered will be the lowest available fare on a direct, non-overnight flight (or as direct as possible, if no direct flights are available). Fares will be Tango or equivalent. Depending on travel distance, arrival the day prior to the start of the Course (ie, March 22) may be required. Registrants who request an alternate flight will be responsible for paying the difference in fare.
 - Registrants will be responsible for making any subsequent changes to their travel bookings and all
 costs associated with these changes.
 - Ground transfers and travel costs other than those listed above will be the registrant's responsibility.

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
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Accommodation
